**Meeting Notes**

- The Day of Caring – This event is held on first Wednesday of May with the goal of getting as many people as possible to volunteer in our schools. Manor School’s project for this year was t-totes. October 25 is Make a Difference Day. The District will pursue the t-totes project as a possible activity for this day. A suggestion was brought up to collect shirts for the project at open houses next year. Senior citizens will be invited to participate to make the project a multi-generational activity. This could be a good service project for students as well.
- Relay for Life – June 6-7 is the Relay for Life. Unfortunately, this is the same night as senior bash. High School Principal David Roth is aware that school and community events will conflict. This year, the District has been working with our community youth group leaders to improve scheduling and communication so that events in the schools and community do not conflict.
- Risk Behavior Task Force – This group is coming to a conclusion in its work. A report with recommendations will be presented at an upcoming Board of Education meeting.
- SADD Club activities – A simulated DWI crash will be held on May 30 in the HS Parking lot. A Poster campaign promoting positive, healthy choices will take place at the HS.
- Skateboard Update – It was suggested that the interested students start a skateboarding club, with parent, student and community involvement, and ask GM to be a sponsor. Rust Belt Skate Shop has worked with Quinn to plan the potential park, and recommended Grindline Concrete Skatepark Design and Construction ([www.grindline.com](http://www.grindline.com)). The Village is looking for feasible ways to improve the parks in Honeoye Falls and add to the current skate park to keep it new and exciting for kids. The high cost of a large project may not be feasible, but making one improvement at a time is manageable. Mr. Callens was suggested as a potential advisor for a school group. Perhaps a fundraiser at Festival on the Green could help get this effort initiated.
- Salvation Army – Money raised through the Kettle campaign stays in our community for one year, then it is gone. We raised around \$2000 this year. This money can be used to help with community members with needs. Contact Chris Gephart with known needs.

- Youth Court Update – Truancy cases are common. Other cases are rare. The Youth Court’s format of kids talking to kids seems to be a convincing impact on those sent to Youth Court.
