The work for 202-21 continues to address the recommendations from our most recent Interscholastic Athletic Program Evaluation



 - **Continue to Formalize Cougar Freight Train as measured by student engagement**


Points of Pride

- 1,221 student athletes in grades 7-12 participated in the HF-L Interscholastic program. We continue to experience a large percentage of participation among both middle and high school students.

- Our teams **continued** to have great success on the field. We celebrated seven league championships, six Section V Championships, and four New York State Championships in 2018-19. This included three individual state champions. Our teams yielded numerous league all-stars, several All-Greater Rochester recipients, and multiple coaches were recognized as the Coach of the Year in their sports.
- 21 of our varsity programs earned the New York State Team Scholar award for carrying a team academic average above 90%. Boys Tennis and Girls' Cross-Country led the way with a Team GPA of 95.20.

Common Ideas, themes

1. The Interscholastic Athletic Program continues to focus on opportunities for diversity and cultural competence. This is evidenced by:
 - The continued implementation and growth of our Unified Basketball Programs at both the Middle and High Schools. These teams not only provide meaningful competitive opportunities for students with disabilities, but their partnering Youth Advisory Committees also implement activities within each building to educate and promote diversity. Both of our schools were recently identified as a NYS Champion School by Special Olympics.
 - In addition to this work, our league has led the way in a commitment towards cultural competence. The league developed a position statement that reads as follows:
 - *On behalf of its member schools, the Monroe County Public School Athletic Conference, Inc. is committed to the promotion of high-spirited competition, fair play, and good sportsmanship at all interscholastic events and to the healthy communities that these qualities promote. Coaches, student athletes, school staffs, and spectators are expected to pursue these goals in positive ways, with unqualified respect for the dignity and humanity of all people. While encouraging high-spirited engagement at athletic events, the Conference and its member schools stand firmly against any mean-spirited speech or behaviors that convey insult, intolerance, or disrespect. Slurs, taunting, ridicule, discrimination, abuse, and other such behaviors hurt individuals, poison the atmosphere of the athletic arena, and bring shame on us all.*
 - Our student athlete leaders continue to attend leadership training provided by Section V. The 2019-20 workshop focused on diversity.
2. In addition to our work on inclusion, the work of our Coaches Advisory Council has been instrumental in providing direction and feedback for our program. From this group, our coaches implemented a PLC with a focus on our strength training for athletes. As a result of their input, we have identified areas of improvement to assist with student achievement.



Budget

- Staffing
 - ✓ Maintain current program offerings
- Supplies
 - ✓ Maintain current supply budget minus a \$2000 reallocation to contractual to support hockey operating costs.
- Equipment
 - ✓ Maintain current equipment replacement plan. The 2020-21 budget includes replacement of our current program used to score swim meets.
- Uniform replacement
 - ✓ Maintain current uniform replacement plan minus a \$2000 reallocation to contractual to support hockey operating costs.
- Professional Development and Training

 - ✓ Maintain NYS participation expenses.

During this time, they had the opportunity to collaborate with student groups from other districts. • The athletic office continues to meet with and identify future leaders of this group to review expectations and opportunities • In partnership with the Art Teachers, Freight Train seating was formally identified in the gym via a painting • In 2019- we identified seating for the ‘Future Freight Train’ • This goal remains a priority for the department as the work of formalize this student group is ongoing.
<p>Improve Football Scheduling</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In 2018, we successfully implemented an independent football schedule to provide equitable competition for our team. • In 2019, Section V adopted a Federation Scheduling philosophy which mean schools of the same size across the section play each other, rather than in leagues. • As a result of these changes, we have maintained extremely high numbers in the football program, especially when compared to schools of similar size. • In 2019, our football team played in the sectional final for the first time in school history.
